

Financial support for students and young researchers from the United States

Financial support from the National Science Foundation (USA) is available to help students and young researchers from the United States to attend the conference. If you are interested in this support please apply by sending email to sg9@nospam.cornell.edu (the correct email address does not include the "nospam." term) with the subject line "financial support Sim Soc Workshop 2011". To be eligible for financial support you must register for the workshop, and either be a current doctoral student in operations research or a related field, or have received your Ph.D. after January 1, 2009. In your email please include your name, contact information, institution/company, name of research advisor (if appropriate) and the date at which you received, or anticipate receiving, your Ph.D. For full consideration we should receive your application by June 30, 2011. The level of funding depends on the number of applicants and will likely cover only a portion of your expenses. Qualified applicants will be notified on how to apply for expense reimbursement in July.

In accordance with NSF rules, this funding is only available to participants from a US institution. Furthermore, any air transportation to, from, between, or within a country other than the US of persons or property, the expense of which will be assisted by NSF funding, must be performed by, or under a code-sharing arrangement with, a US-flag air carrier if service provided by such a carrier is "available" (see Comptroller General Decision B-240956, dated September 25, 1991).
